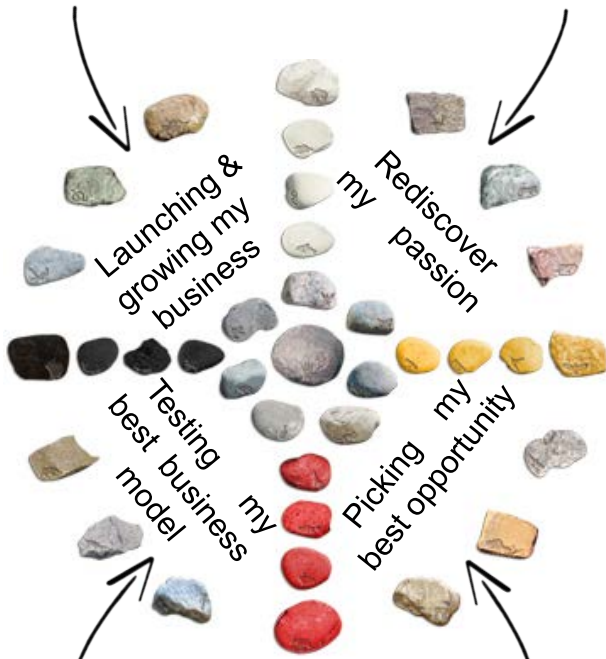

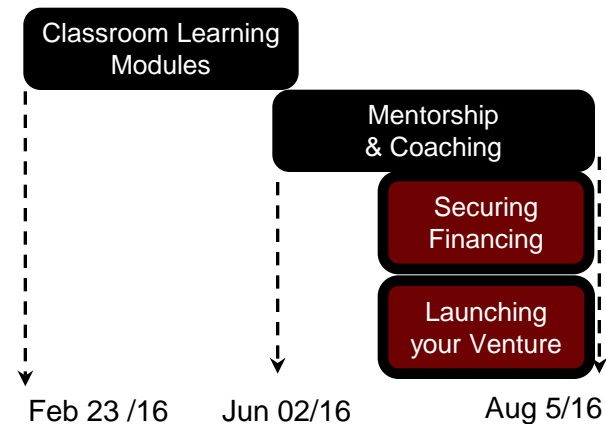
Program Overview
