JOB SUMMARY:

The Resource Technician (Fisheries) is responsible for completing a variety of field-based tasks related to the Tsleil-Waututh territory, with a focus on Burrard Inlet and the Indian River watershed. The position is largely seasonal (July – December), although tasks may continue throughout the spring and winter. Priority will be given to eligible Tsleil-Waututh Nation community members.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES and RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Conduct field work related to:
 - Fisheries (fish stock assessment and habitat enhancement efforts)
 - Community food fish distribution
 - Say Nuth Khaw Yum Provincial Park maintenance
 - Habitat restoration field activities
 - TWN cultural and community events
 - Maintain daily logs of activities and detailed field notes to inform project reporting.
 - Maintain equipment and report servicing/maintenance requirements to field and office supervisor.
 - Prioritize safety in all activities performed, adhering to all workplace health and safety policies, safe work practices and procedures.
 - Attend safety meetings and other TLR meetings with internal and/or external agencies as requested.
 - Attend training courses/programs as required.
 - Accurately report work activities on timesheet with project codes.
 - Provide assistance to other TWN departments, as required.
 - Participate as a member or and a representative of the TWN Treaty, Lands and Resources Department team.
 - Other duties as required.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Valid Class 5 BC Drivers License required.
- Access to a vehicle an asset.
- Reliable method of communication (e.g. personal cell phone) required.
- Ready, willing and able to work.
- Previous experience working physical labour outdoors.
- Grade 12 education (or equivalent) or higher an asset.
- Experience working with machinery (e.g. trucks, motors, utility vehicles) for basic maintenance and troubleshooting.
- Physically fit and competent working outdoors in variable, and sometimes severe, weather conditions.
- Must be flexible and adaptable to changing project tasks and instructions and shifting working priorities and schedules.
- Comfortable working in and around water (both rivers and marine).
- Comfortable working and/or traveling by boat.
- Strong work ethic, self-motivated and ability to work with minimal supervision.
- Punctual, reliable, positive attitude and able to work cohesively as a team.
- Attention to detail and ability to follow direction closely.

- Ability to take and maintain detailed field notes of daily activities.
- Must model adherence to established systems and processes.
- Must be willing to complete job-related training including: Occupational First Aid, Swiftwater Rescue, Bear Aware, MED A3, and Pleasure Craft Operators Card (PCOC), eventually working towards Small Vessel Operator Proficiency (SVOP).
- Knowledge of Tsleil-Waututh Nation culture, traditional territory, and stewardship objectives or initiatives an asset.
- Previous experience working in a First Nation community and/or organization is preferred.
- Experience handling fish and identifying salmon species and gender.
- Comfortable communicating with members of the public.
